Labiaplasty is a surgical procedure to reduce, reshape and recontour the most intimate area of a woman's body.

Potential Risks and Complications

Modern surgery is generally safe but does have the potential for risks and complications to occur.

Some possible complications and risks associated with a labiaplasty may include:

- Excessive bleeding, pain and/or swelling, haematoma
- Asymmetry
- Unacceptable scarring
- Delayed wound healing
- Wound infection
- Over or under correction
- Change in sensation or numbness
- Some complications may require further surgery
- Risks or complications associated with anaesthesia (including drug reactions, toxicity or allergy, deep venous thrombosis and embolus, heart and lung complications)
